The Most Interesting Exhibitions in Central and Eastern Europe

Romania

"In the National Museum of Art of Romanina this season, it is worth going to two large exhibitions. Until October 22, you can see a retrospective of one of the Romanian classics, Ion Grigorescu, focusing on the less known to the broad public, the painting part of the artist's achievements. Although Grigorescu is associated primarily with conceptual works, photography and video, he was educated as a painter and uses this medium throughout his entire career; the exhibition will include works created from the early 1960s to the present year. On the front-line Studio exhibition open until January next year. Romanian Artists in The Great War can see the performance of the Great War by the prominent Romanian artists of the interwar period.

From the gallery offer in the Romanian capital, take a look at the current exhibition at the Sandwich Gallery - The Girl with Tentacles by Delia Popa. It refers to the so-called Shunga, which is a branch of Ukiyo-e art focusing on erotic and pornographic images. Popa recalls in the exhibition the tradition of popular art of his time among all social classes with the exception of the ruling class, while continuing his series of works referring to feminism and marginalization using anthropomorphic drawings."
